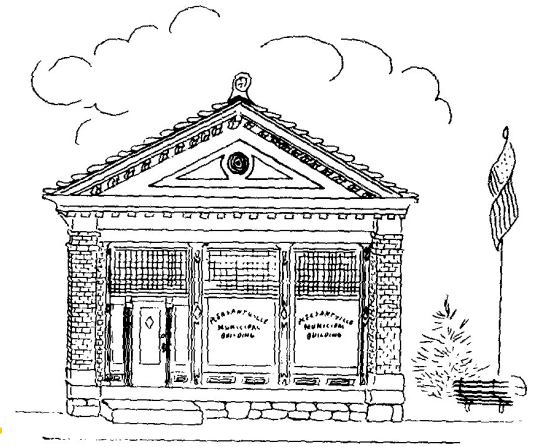

Pleasantville Parks, Community Center and Pool

The Village of Pleasantville is blessed to have such things as parks, a community center, and a pool. Many small villages our size cannot afford the upkeep on properties such as these.

Village Council and Mayor see the need for these properties, they give residents places to go to cool off on hot summer days, play ball with their children, or

spend a summer afternoon at one of our playgrounds. They provide a location to hold family reunions, get togethers, meetings and weddings. All very important aspects of a small village life.

On average the cost to operate our pool during a season is \$30,000. The community center cost to operate during one year

is \$6,000. Our two parks cost to operate is \$4,000. Most of these costs are covered by the Park and Recreations levy that village residents have passed twice now. It generates approximately \$20,000 a year. The rest of the costs are covered by admission and rental fees.

During 2019 the village added, with the help of grants: ADA

compliant sidewalks to the enclosed shelter, play area, and open air shelter. Additional playground equipment was added for smaller children, safety mulch around all play equipment. The new open air shelter was an Eagle Project for Mr. Ben Beiter.

Capital Improvement Projects—2020

MAIN STREET SIDEWALKS

The village was awarded approximately \$200,000 from COBG and DPWC funding for Main Street sidewalk replacement and repairs between Columbus Street and Walnut Street.

With these improvements, residents will see changes to on street parking, off street parking entry points, storm drains and the addition of curbing.

During the time of construction there will be limited access to sidewalks, and there will be temporary parking issues for the area. It is recommended that residents and patrons of the business use caution and find

other parking areas.

The village will work with the businesses and property owners who will be impacted by the construction to ensure safety and proper notification.

WATER TREATMENT PLANT

The village was awarded approximately \$200,000 from DPWC funding for updates at the Water Treatment Plant.

The first phase of the project was completed in late 2019, with the addition of a third well. The second phase will be bid out this spring and will include vault repairs and upgrades, electrical improvements, valve replacement, interior painting. During some of

the project the water plant will have to be taken off line to complete this work.

METER READING UPGRADES

The Village Council approved spending of \$20,000 to upgrade the water meter reading system.

GIS MAPPING

Village Council approved a contract to improve our out dated mapping, to include GIS Mapping of the water distribution system. Mapping will take place during the spring by village employees.
