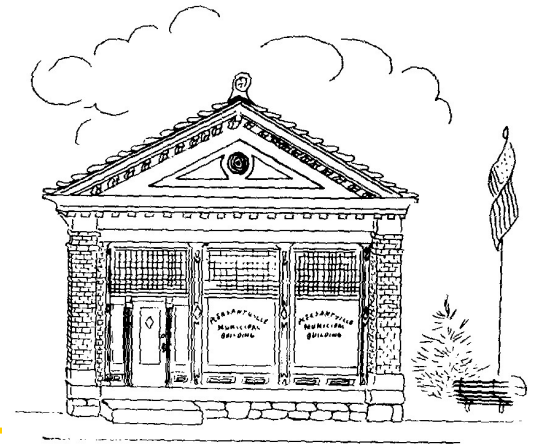

## Pleasantville LaSertoma Community Service

Volunteers and Community Service is what makes small towns thrive and gives the feeling of community amongst their residents. Pleasantville is fortunate to have many civic and community groups within the village. Pleasantville LaSertoma is one of the civic organizations that routinely volunteer within the village on multiple projects. Their motto "Service to man kind" is seen with all the work they do. Each year they volunteer to help make the annual events in town a huge success. They assist with the Easter Egg Hunt, Santa at the old firehouse, trick or treat and any other community projects that the village hosts. Most recently the members approached the village council to update the existing flower and shrub beds at

the Pleasantville Community Center. They provided council with a plan to remove the old out dated shrubs and replace them with updated and fresh shrubbery. They used much of the existing plants and worked with local residents, such as Ms. Mertz to have some of their plants donated. The village purchased the new shrubbery, and the Pleasantville LaSertoma met on Saturday, June 15th to plant.

Members of this club receive service hours, which are logged and submitted to their district leaders, for each service hour that each member performs, and goes toward recognition and awards for each LaSertoma group throughout the State of

## Pleasantville Police Steering Committee

The mayor and village council has set up a steering committee to look at the possibility of creating a Pleasantville Police Department or to find ways to increase police patrols using existing contracts or new contracts.

The members are faced with the challenge of limited funding under the current budget and

revenue resources. They will have to look at alternative funding and possible tax increases to fund a police department. The steering committee will propose to council a plan to include public input, conversations with residents, as well as budget projections and types of funding sources to cover the budget.

Public meetings will be held on a

possible Pleasantville Police Department and the committee, along with the village council will answer questions and lay out a plan.



## Capital Improvement Projects—2019

### PLEASANTVILLE PARK IMPROVEMENTS

The Village of Pleasantville has received funding for capital improvements at the Pleasantville Park. Improvements will include new sidewalks to meet ADA requirements, additional playground equipment designed for the smaller age group, mulching of play areas and upgrading existing play area boarders. The village will also be removing the old play structures that are no longer repairable or outdated.

A new open air shelter house will also be built by Eagle Scout Mr. Ben Beiter, which is privately funded by donations.

### MAIN STREET SIDEWALKS

The sidewalks on both sides of Main Street between Columbus and Walnut Streets will be replaced. Adding drainage and curbing. The village will also be reviewing access spots in this area to reduce the amount, and increase parking along the street. The village will also be working with the property owners so they are aware of the changes and ensure proper access to their properties.

### WATER PLANT UPDATES

The Pleasantville Water Plant is a vital part of the village providing safe drinking water to all village

residents and some residents outside of the village. Continuous improvements and upgrades are needed to ensure the village meets the demands of the EPA and village residents. The village will be adding a new well, to the existing two wells the village currently uses. This will allow the village to pull from an additional source and have enough wells to meet the supply demand if one would go down. The update would also include vault repair and updates to meet EPA requirements and interior painting of the water plant to prohibit rust on metal lines and containers.
