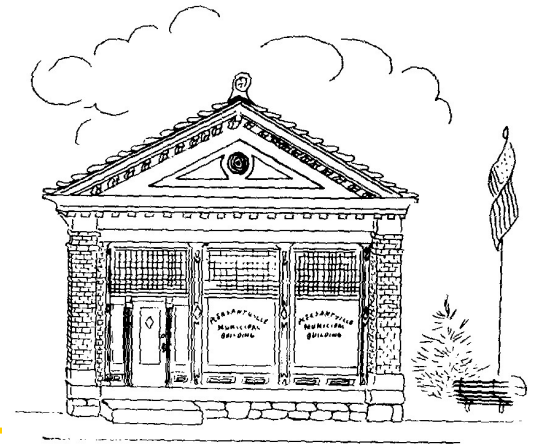

Pleasantville Pool Opens for the 2019 Season

Pleasantville Pool will open Memorial Day weekend this year. Councilwoman Judy Boyer, oversees the pool each year and ensures a safe and fun time for all pool patrons.

It costs the village around \$25,000 per year to operate the village swimming pool. Daily attendance and pool passes generate about \$6,000, and the concession stand generates about \$1,000 in profit. In 2014 village residents passed a property tax that generates about \$20,000 a year to help support the pool, parks and community center.

The pool is open each day of the pool season from 12pm to 7pm and admission is \$3.00 per person from 12pm to 5pm and \$1.50

per person from 5pm to 7pm. Children 3 and under are free with a paid adult. Seasonal pool passes are available by calling the Village Office at 740-468-2237.

Pleasantville and Baltimore Partner for Zoning Enforcement

The Village's of Pleasantville and Baltimore continue to partner together to efficiently protect the villages we serve. As state funding decreases, grants are becoming more competitive, we have to look at efficiencies and how we can partner with other small villages to provide important services to our residents. In early 2019 both villages were looking for a zoning/

property maintenance inspector, both villages have limited funds for this position and neither village has a need for a full-time inspector. The two villages decided to partner and hire one part-time inspector that can serve both villages, using the same documents, procedures, etc. This helps with the efficiency of the office, as well as helps with sending cases to Baltimore

Mayors Court. The inspector will be responsible for zoning permits, violations, etc. As well as property maintenance violations, citing violations into Mayors Court.

Upcoming Capital Improvement Projects—2019

ODNR GRANT—NATUREWORKS

The Village of Pleasantville was awarded a park improvement grant for Pleasantville Park. The total cost of the project will be \$96,000 and will include demo of the old outdated playground equipment, removal of the gravel play area and wooden borders. Replacing it with a grassy area allowing more room for sports activities. The Village will also be adding new play structures to the new play area and sidewalks. We are excited about the newest additions to our park and look forward to improving our parks for residents.

MAIN STREET SIDEWALKS

The Village Council and Mayor are working on additional funding to continue the Main Street Sidewalk improvements. The Village has secured funding through the CDBG funding source and have applied for OPWC funding for additional monies. Together, the total funds for sidewalk improvements will be around \$200,000 and will focus on the area between Columbus and Walnut Streets and branch out from there. With these improvements, residents will see changes to parking, entry points, etc. Unfortunately, the State of Ohio Grant through ODOT was not awarded, this was for a large improvement to Main Street side-

walks. This grant total was over \$900,000, but the village did not rank high enough according to the points system. In addition to that, when ODOT inspected our current sidewalks, they found infractions like overhangs and residents parking on sidewalks, new and old.

As a reminder, it is illegal to park vehicles on any public sidewalk and you can be ticketed. Parking vehicles on sidewalks causes them to breakdown as they are not made to withstand the weight.
